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## **IDPH releases COVID-19 vaccine frequently asked questions**

## **AHA urges unified guidelines to lead COVID-19 vaccine allocation process**

The AHA has urged the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine to adopt a unified set of guidelines to account for the variables associated with all issues of the eventual allocation of COVID-19 vaccine allocation. In a letter to the academies, AHA stressed the importance of a singular message to the public and other stakeholders to ensure the process remains equitable.

## **CMS issues surveyor guidance for COVID-19 testing for labs and long-term care**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recently issued new surveyor guidance for COVID-19 laboratory test result reporting for Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments-certified laboratories. The new guidance complements a Sept. 2 interim final rule. Laboratories are expected to comply with the new requirements no later than Wednesday, Sept. 23. After that date, laboratories not in compliance will be subject to civil monetary penalties. CMS also released new enforcement regulations for long-term care facility reporting requirements. ## **New CPT codes address new understanding of COVID-19**

An [updated set](#) of current procedural terminology codes includes two for reporting medical services necessitated during the COVID-19 pandemic. The American Medical Association yesterday announced the update, which include:

- CPT code 99072, which describes additional supplies and clinical staff time to perform safety protocols for the provision of evaluation, treatment or procedural services during a public health emergency in a setting where extra precautions are taken to ensure the safety of patients and health care professionals.
- CPT code 86413, which accounts for laboratory tests that can measure antibodies to investigate a person's adaptive immune response to the virus and help assess the effectiveness of treatments used against the infection.

Long, short and medium descriptors for both codes can be accessed on the AMA website, with several other recent modifications to the CPT code set that have helped streamline the public health response to COVID-19.
