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Medical residency grants program accepting applications


The <u>Medical Residency Training State Matching Grants Program</u> is accepting applications, which are due Monday, Feb. 8. The purpose of the program is to establish or expand medical residency training programs, particularly in emergency medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, and psychiatry. In addition, candidates who are residents of lowa, attended and earned an undergraduate degree from an lowa college or university, or attended and earned a medical degree from a medical school in lowa will be given preference in receiving grants. Residency participants will have the opportunity to participate in a rotation in a rural setting.

Medicare physician fee schedule modified for 2021

The 2021 Consolidated Appropriations Act has modified the 2021 calendar year Medicare physician fee schedule. For calendar year 2021, the changes:

- Delay the inherent-complexity add-on code for evaluation and management services (G2211) to calendar year 2024.
- Provide a 3.75% increase in schedule payments.
- Reinstate the 1.0 floor on the work geographic practice cost index through calendar year 2023.
- Suspend the 2% payment adjustment (sequestration) through Wednesday, March 31.

CMS has recalculated the schedule rates and conversion factor to reflect these changes. The revised schedule conversion factor for calendar year 2021 is 34.8931. The revised payment rates are available in the downloads section of the CY 2021 Physician Fee Schedule webpage.



EEOC proposes rule tackling workplace wellness incentives

The <u>U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission</u> (EEOC) has proposed a rule regarding what employers can do to encourage workers to join corporate wellness programs.

The <u>proposal</u> lays out the level of incentives employers can use to motivate workers to take part in smoking-cessation seminars, fitness classes and other workplace health programs without violating the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act.

Under the new proposal, employers are advised to only offer small incentives such as a water bottle or a small gift card to bring workers into an initiative requiring them to provide medical details.

The EEOC said the plan should alleviate concerns that offering bigger rewards makes the programs less voluntary and coerces workers into revealing sensitive health information. Federal law allows businesses to reward workers who sign up for corporate wellness programs that often request health risk assessments, biometric screenings or other medical data from participants, as long as those initiatives are voluntary.

The proposal has been sent to the Federal Register for publishing. Stakeholders will have two months to submit comments on the plan after its published.
