# Physician Business Leadership Certificate Program accepting applications

# Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program application cycle now open


The Health Resources and Services Administration has opened the 2021 <u>Nurse Corps Loan</u> <u>Repayment Program</u> application cycle. The program offers funding to registered nurses, advanced practice registered nurses and nursing faculty for payment of their qualifying educational loans. In exchange, recipients honor a two-year service commitment at a health care facility with a critical shortage of nurses or an eligible school of nursing in the case of nurse faculty. Additional loan repayment is available for a third year of service.

This year, special funding is available for nurses and nurse faculty who specialize in women's and behavioral health:

- Up to \$5 million for applicants working as women's health nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives or certified RNs in obstetrics and gynecology.
- Up to 50% of the remaining funds for nurse practitioners and up to 10% for nurse faculty. Of the 50% allocated for nurse practitioners, up to 20% is available for psychiatric nurse practitioners.

Before applying, review the <u>Application and Program Guidance</u> for information on eligibility and requirements. **The application cycle closes Thursday, Feb. 25.**
